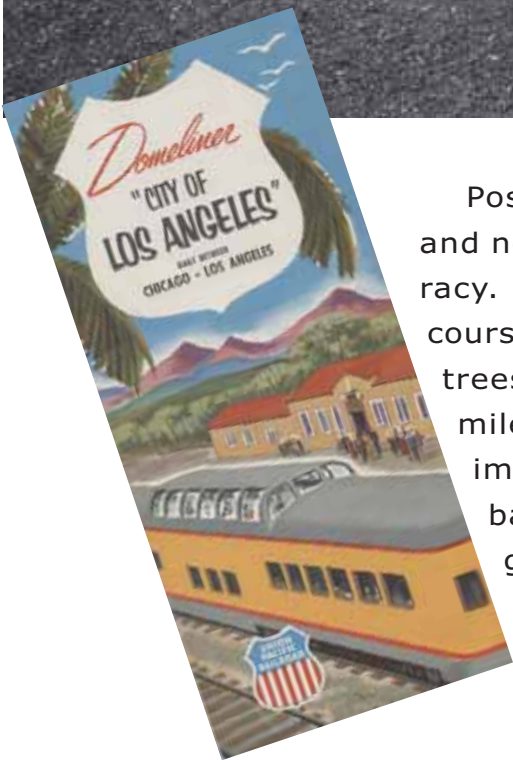


One engine of America's proud 32 streamliners in the forties.
